Biographies

Professor Rolf Barth



Rolf Barth is Assistant Professor of Surgery at the University of Maryland School of Medicine specializing in kidney, pancreas and liver transplantation.

Dr Barth received his medical degree and surgical training and continued speciality training in transplant surgery at the University of Wisconsin, Madison.

Dr Barth also performed post-doctoral training in transplant immunology at Massachusetts General Hospital / Harvard Medical School

Professor Daniel Cherqui



Dr. Daniel Cherqui is Professor and Chief of Hepatobiliary Surgery and Liver Transplantation at New York-Presbyterian/Weill Cornell Medical Center. He is an internationally-renowned and highly experienced board-certified surgeon, having performed over 2,000 complex hepatobiliary and liver transplant procedures over the past two decades. He developed innovations in minimally invasive techniques in liver surgery and was the first to use laparoscopic techniques in living donor liver transplantation. Dr. Cherqui is an expert in the management of primary and secondary liver cancer. Under his leadership, the new liver program at NYP/Weill Cornell provides patients with state-of-the-art, personalized, multidisciplinary approach to their liver disease.
